Lottie Moon

Every Christmas season, WMU promotes an offering for those serving with the International Mission Board, using 100 percent of the funds collected for missionary support. This offering has impacted thousands of missionaries and is significant because it is named for Lottie Moon, a remarkable missionary and WMU pioneer.

Charlotte “Lottie” Moon was born into a wealthy Southern family in 1840. Though her mother was a devout Baptist, Lottie was not converted until adulthood. For many years, she was a skeptic, in part due to her older sister Orianna’s influence. Orianna was one of the first women to graduate from medical school in America and intensely cynical of religion.

While on a trip to the Holy Land in the spring of 1858, Orianna’s eyes were opened to the gospel and she returned home a believer in Jesus. God used Orianna to speak to Lottie and by winter of that year, Lottie also came to know Jesus.

Lottie was very intelligent and one of the first American women to earn her master of arts degree. While in school, the desire to serve overseas began to grow in Lottie’s heart. She was ready to go immediately, but the Lord had her wait. She worked as a teacher and nurse during the Civil War trusting God with her desire to go overseas. Finally, on September 1, 1873, she boarded a boat and set sail for China.
